

AUTOMATIC AID AGREEMENT
FOR FIRE PROTECTION AND OTHER EMERGENCY SERVICES
FOR CROW MOUNTAIN FIRE DEPARTMENT AND CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE

Automatic Aid –

A program designed to provide and /or receive assistance from the closest available resource irrespective of municipal boundaries.

Intent:

- Persons experiencing the emergency receive a seamless service through the elimination of artificial service boundaries.
- The implementation of an automatic aid program can enhance the level of public safety
- The concept of automatically dispatch the closest available assistance could reduce the critical element of time between the commencement of a fire or rescue and the application of an extinguishing agent to the fire and/or initiation of emergency operations
- Life, property, and environmental losses may be subsequently reduced and improve firefighter and public safety.
- Persons living or working in the defined potential areas would all stand to receive an improved level of service should an automatic aid program be implemented

Agreement:

For the purposes of this agreement, and automatic aid agreement means any agreement under which:

- A. A jurisdiction agrees to ensure the provision of an initial response to fires or other emergencies that may occur in a part of another jurisdiction where a fire department in the jurisdiction is capable of response more quickly than any fire department situated in the other jurisdiction
- B. A jurisdiction agrees to ensure the provision of a supplemental response to fires or other emergencies that may occur in a part of another jurisdiction where a fire department situated in the jurisdiction is capable of providing the quickest supplemental response to fires or other emergencies occurring in the part of the other jurisdiction.

Response Area:

For the purposes of this agreement, response area is the geographical area and/or physical location in which a jurisdiction shall provide or receive automatic aid.

The Crow Mountain Fire Department shall provide automatic aid in the specified areas of the City of Russellville:

- North Phoenix Avenue from West "L" St to North Glenwood Ave
- Sparksford Drive
- Old Hwy 124 from Sparksford Drive to Hwy 124
- Weird Road from East Strutka to Old Hwy 124
- Hob Nob Road

- North Arkansas Avenue from Pleasantview Road to Round Rock Road
- Pleasantview Road
- Bradley Cove Road
- West Parkway Drive from 1000 block to 1300 block

The City of Russellville shall provide automatic aid in the specified areas of the Crow Mountain Fire District:

- Encompassing area from N Arkansas Ave/Center Valley Road to State Hwy 124/Crow Mountain Road
- Encompassing area from Crow Mountain Road to intersection of Maple Springs Rd and Double Springs Rd, South to intersection of Double Springs Rd and Crow Mountain Road. To Include: Roy Rd, Ruth Ln, Stoneridge Cr, Stonegate Dr, and Greystone Ln.
- Streets on northern side of Crow Mountain Road including: Ridgeview Ln, Cagle Rock Cir, Estes Cir, Day Ln, N Sherman Cir, N Sherman Dr, Shiloh Pines Ln, Artist Ln, Longcole Pl, Buie Ln, Maewen Cir
- Streets on southern side of Bradley Cove Road including: Richland Dr, Richland Cir, Talley Dr, Hillside Dr, Galla Creek Ln
- Cove Landing Estates including: Cliff Road, Guiding Light Pl, Park Rd, Becky Blvd, Kathy Dr, Center Rd, Stream Rd, and Forest Rd

The Crow Mountain Fire Department and City of Russellville hereby agree to automatic aid in concept and intent, recognizing the benefit of automatic aid to both the communities of Crow Mountain and Russellville.

Additionally, the Crow Mountain Fire Department and City of Russellville accept provisions as outlined in the operational procedural and response criteria set forth in this agreement.

In the event that the municipality providing automatic aid is unavailable due to an existing fire, rescue, or other emergency within its primary jurisdiction or apparatus are out of service due to mechanical circumstance, the jurisdiction providing assistance is not obligate to respond to the jurisdiction receiving assistance.

Response Operations:

For the purpose of this agreement, the response operations agreement means any agreement under which:

- A jurisdiction agrees to ensure the use of standard operation procedures (SOPs) in regards to fire and rescue training/tactics.
- A jurisdiction agrees to ensure the use of the Unified Incident Command System during the fire and rescue incident
- A jurisdiction agrees to ensure the use of a common fireground communication frequency.

Response Criteria:

The Crow Mountain Fire Department:

The department shall provide two water tanker/tenders or tanker/pumpers and one officer for structure fire calls excluding automatic alarm activations, within the designated automatic aid area.

Additional resources, equipment, or personnel beyond what is specified in this agreement will require authorizing party approval.

Upon arrival, following incident size-up, the Incident Commander (IC) shall have the authority to cancel responding units.


The City of Russellville Fire Department:

The department shall provide one pumper with three personnel and one officer for structure fire calls excluding automatic alarm activations, within the designated automatic aid area.

Additional resources, equipment, or personnel beyond what is specified in this agreement will require authorizing party approval.

Upon arrival, following incident size-up, the Incident Commander (IC) shall have the authority to cancel responding units.


